### Scholarships

The Pat Farry Rural Health Education Trust currently considers applications for two scholarships; the annual Pat Farry Rural Health Education Trust Travelling Scholarships. This scholarship is under consideration, and is dependent upon funding availability.

**The Pat Farry Rural Health Education Trust Travelling Scholarship** is awarded annually subject to funding availability and receipt of suitable applications. The amount of the funds available is up to 1,000.00 each recipient.

The Scholarship is available to students of the University of Otago Faculty of Medicine to be specifically used to subsidise costs of accommodation and travel within New Zealand as part of their Trainee Intern (6th year) Elective. Scholarship applications will be invited from 5th Year students based in Wellington, Christchurch or Dunedin Schools to enable their advanced elective planning. Preference will be given to those participating in the 5th Year Rural Medical Immersion Programme.

The Trust will expect the recipient of the Scholarship to present a formal report to the Trustees (within a timeframe agreed) as well as at a national event, such as the New Zealand Rural GP Network's annual conference.
